

"Thanks for the gift, but what is it?" The readings for the Festival of Christmas tell us what God's Christmas gift <u>is</u>. Many heresies that plagued Christianity throughout the centuries sprang from an incorrect answer to this question. The Athanasian Creed answers: "He is God, eternally begotten from the nature of his Father, and he is man, born in time from the nature of his mother, fully God, fully man, with rational soul and human flesh." If this child is God and man in one person, then he is exactly what the human race needs to deliver it from its enemies of sin, death, and Satan.

SERMON

HYMN

God's first act of creation in the beginning was light—necessary so humanity could see the glory of the rest of his creation. The incarnation is another beginning—a light necessary so fallen humanity could once again see God's glory.

¹In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. ²He was with God in the beginning. ³Through him everything was made, and without him not one thing was made that has been made. ⁴In him was life, and the life was the light of mankind. ⁵The light is shining in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it.

⁶There was a man, sent from God, whose name was John. ⁷He came as an eyewitness to testify about the light so that everyone would believe through him. ⁸He was not the light, but he came to testify about the light.

⁹The real light that shines on everyone was coming into the world. ¹⁰He was in the world, and the world was made through him, yet the world did not recognize him. ¹¹He came to what was his own, yet his own people did not accept him. ¹²But to all who did receive him, to those who believe in his name, he gave the right to become children of God. ¹³They were born, not of blood, or of the desire of the flesh, or of a husband's will, but born of God.

STATEMENT OF FAITH – ATHANASIAN CREED

The ancient church wrote this creed to define the minimum belief necessary to be considered Christian. This morning we will use only the second half of this lengthy creed: that Jesus is true God and true man and that he is our Savior.

P: Let us confess our holy faith in the words of the Athanasian Creed:

It is necessary for eternal salvation that one also faithfully believe the incarnation of our Lord Jesus Christ.

Therefore it is the true faith that we believe and confess that our Lord Jesus Christ, the Son of God, is at once God and a human being.

He is God, begotten from the substance of the Father before all ages, and a human being, born from the substance of his mother in this age.

He is perfect God and a perfect human being, composed of a rational soul and human flesh.

He is equal to the Father with respect to his divinity, less than the Father with respect to his humanity.

Although he is God and a human being, nevertheless he is not two but one Christ.

However, he is one not by the changing of the divinity in the flesh but by the taking up of the humanity in God.

Indeed, he is one not by a confusion of substance but by a unity of person.

For, as the rational soul and the flesh are one human being, so God and the human being are one Christ.

He suffered for our salvation, descended into hell, rose from the dead,

ascended into the heavens, is seated at the right hand of the Father, from where he will come to judge the living and the dead.

At his coming all human beings will rise with their bodies and will give an account of their own deeds.

Those who have done good things [accomplished only through faith] will enter into eternal life, and those who have done evil things into eternal fire.

This is the Christian faith; a person cannot be saved without believing this firmly, and faithfully.

CONFESSION AND ABSOLUTION

- P: Friends in Christ, let us confess our sins to God our Father, because Jesus Christ came to earth as a human being for us, to take away our sins.
- C: Lord God, our heavenly Father, I confess that I have sinned against you, not only in my words and actions, but also in my secret thoughts and desires which I cannot fully know or understand, but which you know completely. I am sorry that I have displeased you, and repent of the evil I have done. For the sake of your dear Son, Jesus Christ our Lord, have mercy on me, forgive my sins, and graciously help me in my weakness. Amen.
- P: Lift up your hearts unto God! Almighty God, our heavenly Father, has had mercy upon us, and has given his only Son to die for us, and for his sake forgives us all our sins. To all who believe on his name he gives the power to become the children of God, and has promised them his Holy Spirit. He who believes and is baptized will be saved. Grant this, Lord, unto us all. Amen.
