KING OF GRACE LUTHERAN CHURCH Golden Valley, Minnesota The Christian church at the beginning of the sixteenth century was not communicating God's gospel to the world. The good news of great joy in Jesus Christ was buried under the bad news of more sins, more money, more sacrifices, more rules.

On Reformation Sunday we celebrate the restoration to the center of the church's message the truth that we are saved by grace alone, which is revealed by Scripture alone and received by faith alone. That is good news for those struggling to remain faithful to the Lord and his Word.

Hymn

This hymn is often referred to as "the battle hymn" of the Reformation. It was sung in the streets; it was sung by poor Protestant emigrants on their way to exile; it was sung by Lutheran martyrs at their death; and Gustavus Adolphus ordered it sung by his army before battle in 1631.

- P: Almighty God, our Maker and Redeemer, we poor sinners confess to you both that we are by nature sinful and unclean, and also that we have each sinned against you in our thoughts, words, and actions. Therefore we flee for refuge toward your infinite mercy, pleading for your grace on the basis of the work of our Lord Jesus Christ.
- C: O most merciful God, you have given your only-begotten Son to die for us. Have mercy upon us and for his sake grant us remission of all our sins. And by your Holy Spirit, increase in us true knowledge of you and of your will, and true obedience to your Word, to the end that by your grace we may come to everlasting life; through Jesus Christ, our Lord. Amen.
- P: Lift up your hearts to God! Almighty God, our heavenly Father, has had mercy upon us. He has given his only-begotten Son to die for us, and on the basis of Jesus' work forgives us all our sins. To all who believe in his name he gives the power to become the children of God, and has promised them his Holy Spirit. Whoever believes and is baptized will be saved. Grant this, Lord, to us all.

C: Amen. Thanks be to God!

OLD TESTAMENT READING

Jeremiah 31:31-34

GRACE ALONE: The Israelites couldn't keep the old covenant's laws and works. God's new covenant is not more works, but is given completely by his grace.

³¹Yes, the days are coming, declares the LORD, when I will make a new covenant with the house of Israel and with the house of Judah. ³²It will not be like the covenant I made with their fathers, when I took them by the hand and led them out of the land of Egypt. They broke that covenant of mine, although I was a husband to them, declares the LORD.

³³But this is the covenant I will make with the house of Israel after those days, declares the LORD. I will put my law in their minds, and I will write it on their hearts. I will be their God, and they will be my people. ³⁴No longer will each one teach his neighbor, or each one teach his brother, saying, "Know the LORD," because they will all know me, from the least of them to the greatest, declares the LORD, for I will forgive their guilt, and I will remember their sins no more.

NEW TESTAMENT READING

FAITH ALONE: God's new covenant is received by us only through faith; that is, trust in his gracious promises to make us righteous.

¹It is for freedom that Christ has set us free. Stand firm, then, and do not allow anyone to put the yoke of slavery on you again. ²Look, I, Paul, tell you that if you allow yourselves to be circumcised, Christ will be of no benefit to you. ³I testify again to every man who allows himself to be circumcised that he is obligated to do the whole law. ⁴You who are trying to be declared righteous by the law are completely separated from Christ. You have fallen from grace.

⁵Indeed, through the Spirit, we by faith are eagerly waiting for the sure hope of righteousness. ⁶For in Christ Jesus neither circumcision nor uncircumcision matters. Rather, it is faith working through love that matters.
